Fun Facts

- The corn plant is a grass! Native peoples of what is now Mexico developed corn from a wild grass called teosinte (tay-oh-seen-tay).
- Corn is known as maize in most countries. This comes from the Spanish word maiz, which comes from the Taino word for corn, mahiz.
- Corn grows on stalks that usually reach 7-10 feet high. Each stalk produces 1-3 ears of corn. An ear of corn always has an even number of rows of kernels.
- Corn provides potassium and magnesium, which are both good for your heart! Nutrition Programs & Services
