FOSTER YOUTH EDUCATION SERVICES

Legislation was created by the state of California to assist and support foster youth in achieving their educational goals. School districts are mandated to have a foster youth liaison to assist with:

- School Stability: remain in their original school when they enter foster care or move
- Immediate Enrollment: be immediately enrolled in a new school
- Partial Credit: receive partial or full credit for work completed at other schools (all students have this right)
- Fairness: not be punished for courtrelated absences.
- Transferring records to a child's new school within 2 business days
- Allowing county placing agencies to access students' records
- Designating a foster youth educational liaison for every district and county office of education

MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS EDUCATION SERVICES

In 2001, McKinney-Vento legislation was created to ensure homeless youth have equal access to the same free and appropriate public education, including public preschool programs, as other students.

School districts are mandated to have a homeless youth liaison to assist with:

- The right to immediate enrollment in school regardless of living situation
- Timely transfer of education records
- The right to stay in their school of origin

- Transportation planning to remain in school of origin
- Enrollment in the free/reduced lunch program
- Obtaining immunizations and medical records
- Links to college and vocational education programs
- Designating a homeless youth educational liaison for every district and county office of education
