

SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT CARD

The Classroom Instructional Improvement and Accountability Act requires each school district and county office of education to prepare, publish and issue an annual School Accountability Report Card for each school site beginning in the 1989-90 school year.

The Board of Education shall adopt annual reports for the Glen Paul School and Court and Community Schools that will meet the requirements of the School Accountability Report Card.

The Superintendent/designees shall be responsible for preparing the reports, which shall accurately communicate to the public, in a clear and understandable manner, an assessment of the reportable school conditions specified by law. The reports may also include any other supplemental information that might be helpful to the public in understanding the mission and goals of the schools, their progress towards meeting those goals, and identified areas of need at the school site. Upon adoption by the Board of Education, the public shall be advised that copies of the reports are available and will be provided upon request. The School Accountability Report Cards shall be accessible on the Internet.

Once every three years, the Board of Education will compare the school site annual reports against the Model School Accountability Report Card prepared by the State Department of Education.
