DRUGS, TOBACCO, ALCOHOL

Drugs and Alcohol

The Office of Education will take positive action through education, counseling, parental involvement, medical referral, and law enforcement referral when appropriate in the handling of incidents in the schools involving the possession, sale, furnishing, and/or influence of a controlled substance, including alcohol, drug paraphernalia, and/or chemical forms affecting student behavior.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop, implement and evaluate a comprehensive prevention and intervention program that is coordinated with other school and community-based services and programs. The Office of Education's program shall be scientifically based and designed to prevent or reduce alcohol or other drug use and the possession and distribution of illegal drugs. It shall include primary prevention activities such as decision-making skills and conflict management, instruction, referral to a rehabilitation program, enforcement/discipline, activities that involvement promote the of parents/guardians and coordination with appropriate community agencies and organizations.

Students under the influence of, or involved in, the possession, sale and/or use of alcohol, controlled substances or drug paraphernalia, shall be subject to disciplinary procedures which may result in suspension, transfer to an alternative placement, expulsion, or referral to law enforcement.

School properties may be inspected by school authorities in the interest of maintenance, health and safety. Inspections for the location of drugs, narcotics, liquor, weapons, poisons and missing properties are matters relating to health and safety and may be regarded as reasonable purposes for inspection by school personnel, so long as such inspections are conducted in accordance with constitutional requirements of applicable state law and federal law relating to searches and seizures.

Tobacco

The Superintendent and Board recognize that smoking presents a health hazard which can have serious consequences both for the smoker and the non-smoker and is, therefore, of concern to the Board and the Office of Education.

Students shall not be allowed to smoke, chew or possess tobacco or nicotine products on school property, at school sponsored events, or while under the supervision of school employees. This policy shall apply whether on or off campus or during or outside of regular school hours. Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel. Student's possession or use of electronic cigarettes, electronic hookahs, and other vapor-emitting devices, with or without nicotine content, that mimic the use of tobacco products is also prohibited.

Students who violate this policy shall be subject to disciplinary procedures which may result in suspension from school. Tobacco products possessed by a student in violation of this policy may be confiscated by school staff.

These prohibitions do not apply to a student's possession or use of his/her own prescription products. However, student possession or use of prescription products in school shall be subject to the policy for addressing the administration of medications on campus.

Prevention Instruction

The Superintendent shall provide developmentally appropriate instruction regarding the effects of tobacco use on the human body and shall take steps to discourage students from making it a practice to use tobacco products. The Office of Education's prevention/intervention program shall be based on an ongoing assessment of objective data regarding tobacco use in the schools and community and on research identifying strategies that have proven effective in preventing or reducing tobacco use among youth. Instruction shall be aligned with the state content standards and the state curriculum framework for health education and with any requirements of state and/or federal grant programs in which the Office of Education participates.

The program shall be designed to meet a set of measurable goals and objectives and shall be periodically evaluated to assess progress.
