TRANSFER OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

TRANSFERRING TO A CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CSU)

CSU Transfer Requirements-General Education: As part of the requirements for a bachelor's degree, all CSU students must meet general education requirements. The California State University General Education –Breadth requirements includes a minimum of 48 semesters (72 quarter) units, which consist of 39 semester (58.5 quarter) units of lower division and at least 9 semester (12 quarter) units of upper division courses. Students can fulfill the lower division requirements at a community college prior to transferring to the CSU.

<u>Transferring General Education (GE) Requirements</u>: California community college students may complete all of the 39 semester (58.5 quarter) units of lower-division courses for CSU GE-Breadth Requirements (for CSU only) for the Intersegmental General <u>Education Transfer Curriculum (http://www.calstate.edu/transfer/requirements/igetc.shtml</u>) (for both CSU and UC) at a California community college before transferring to a CSU campus.

California Community Colleges and other qualified institutions can certify completion of up to 39 lower-division semester (58.5 quarter) units applicable to GE-Breadth requirements or a total package of 37 semester (58.5 quarter) units for IGETC

The CSU GE-Breadth Requirements is a lower division 39 semester (58.5 quarter) unity pattern. Transfer students must take specified courses in the areas of:

- Area A English Language Communication and Critical Thinking
- Area B Scientific Inquiry and Quantitative Reasoning

- Area C Arts and Humanities
- Area D Social Sciences

Each California Community College has a list of courses that can be used in each of the areas. (This list is also available at www.assist.org).

Each of the areas has a minimum number of units or courses. See the CSUMentor Transfer Student Planner (https://secure.csumentor.edu/logon.asp?nextpage=/planning/transfer/transfer_planner.asp%3F%26) for more information about each of the areas.

TRANSFERRING TO A UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (UC)

The vast majority of transfer students come to UC at the junior level from California community colleges. But there is a way for sophomore students to gain admission, too. Junior-level transfer: To be considered for UC admission as a junior, you must fulfill both of the following:

- 1. Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) units of transferable college credit with a GPA of at least 2.4 (2.8 if you're a nonresident). No more than 14 semester (21 quarter) units may be taken Pass/Not Pass.
- 2. Complete the following course pattern requirements, and earn a grade of C or better in each course:
 - 2 transferrable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter unites each) in English Composition
 - 1 transferrable college course (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning;
 - 4 transferrable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) chosen from at least 2 of the following subject
 - Arts and humanities
 - Social and behavioral sciences
 - Physical and biological sciences
