Foster youth in California have special rights to help them remain on track for high school graduation. Under Assembly Bills 167/216, foster youth who are off track for high school graduation and transfer after their second year of high school, may be eligible to graduate by completing the minimum state requirements if they are not reasonably able to complete all school district requirements by the end of their fourth year of high school. This requirement includes 13 core year-long courses. Students who graduate under AB 167/216 do not have to complete additional school district requirements, which generally range from 80-120 credits.

The above student  *QUALIFIES*  *DOES NOT QUALIFY* for AB 167/216

The above student has the following graduation options and has chosen:

Graduate by completing state requirements and accept AB167/216 eligibility. Students who accept this option may not be eligible to directly apply to a California State University or University of California school after graduation. They will be able to apply to attend a community college. They will be able to graduate with their classmates and receive a regular high school diploma.

Attempt to graduate high school at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> year by completing all school district graduation requirements. Students may attempt to accomplish this by concurrently enrolling in a community college, continuation school, or independent study program.

Remain in high school for a 5<sup>th</sup> year and complete all additional school district graduation requirements. The right to a 5<sup>th</sup> year of high school applies even if the student will be 19 years old during that additional school year. The student will be allowed to remain at the local high school and will not be required to transfer to a continuation school, independent study program, or adult school to complete the 5<sup>th</sup> year.

Please find the attached AB 167/216 contract included with this letter. You will find an outline of what credits are still needed to complete graduation. The student's Foster Youth Education Liaison will review this contract with the student and provide credit updates every quarter. An updated contract will be provided at semester.

## TRANSFER OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

TRANSFERRING TO A CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY (CSU)

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CSU Transfer Requirements-General Education: As part of the requirements for a bachelor's degree, all CSU students must meet general education requirements. The California State University General Education -Breadth requirements includes a minimum of 48 semesters (72 quarter) units, which consist of 39 semester (58.5 quarter) units of lower division and at least 9 semester (12 quarter) units of upper division courses. Students can fulfill the lower division requirements at a community college prior to transferring to the CSU.

Transferring General Education (GE) Requirements: California community college students may complete all of the 39 semester (58.5 quarter) units of lower-division courses for CSU GE-Breadth Requirements (for CSU only) for the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (<http://www.calstate.edu/transfer/requirements/igetc.shtml>) (for both CSU and UC) at a California community college before transferring to a CSU campus.

California Community Colleges and other qualified institutions can certify completion of up to 39 lower-division semester (58.5 quarter) units applicable to GE-Breadth requirements or a total package of 37 semester (58.5 quarter) units for IGETC

The CSU GE-Breadth Requirements is a lower division 39 semester (58.5 quarter) unity pattern. Transfer students must take specified courses in the areas of:

- Area A - English Language Communication and Critical Thinking
- Area B - Scientific Inquiry and Quantitative Reasoning
- Area C - Arts and Humanities
- Area D - Social Sciences
- Area E - Lifelong Learning and Self-Development

Each California Community College has a list of courses that can be used in each of the areas. (This list is also available at [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org)).

Each of the areas has a minimum number of units or courses. See the CSUMentor Transfer Student Planner ([https://secure.csumentor.edu/logon.asp?nextpage=/planning/transfer/transfer\\_planner.asp%3F%26](https://secure.csumentor.edu/logon.asp?nextpage=/planning/transfer/transfer_planner.asp%3F%26)) for more information about each of the areas.

TRANSFERRING TO A UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (UC)

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The vast majority of transfer students come to UC at the junior level from California community colleges. But there is a way for sophomore students to gain admission, too. Junior-level transfer: To be considered for UC admission as a junior, you must fulfill both of the following:

1. Complete 60 semester (90 quarter) units of transferable college credit with a GPA of at least 2.4 (2.8 if you're a nonresident). No more than 14 semester (21 quarter) units may be taken Pass/Not Pass.
2. Complete the following course pattern requirements, and earn a grade of C or better in each course:
  - 2 transferrable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter unites each) in English Composition
  - 1 transferrable college course (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning;
  - 4 transferrable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 quarter units) chosen from at least 2 of the following subject areas:
    - Arts and humanities
    - Social and behavioral sciences
    - Physical and biological sciences
