College Affordability


The issue of college affordability is at the forefront of the conversation in our nation and state. The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) recently conducted a Student Expenses and Resource **Survey** (SEARS) to look at the perceived obstacles students face affording higher education. The survey data, which will guide further legislative action for Cal-SOAP revitalization and Cal-Grant reform, found that cost-related factors were by far the largest perceived obstacle to college success. However, just 45% of Humboldt and Del Norte county seniors completed a FAFSA or CADAA application last year!

Where Cal-SOAP Comes In

Given how important financial aid is to college-going rates, a major goal of North Coast Cal-SOAP is to increase the number of students who apply.

National statistics show that 84% of high schoolers who complete the FAFSA go directly on to college, compared to only 55% of those who don't. But currently, only about half of North Coast high school seniors complete a FAFSA/CADAA.

Cal-SOAP (Student Opportunity and Access Program) is a project of CSAC, and is being positioned and supported to take the lead in assisting schools throughout the state to improve their financial aid numbers and college going rates.

Make FAFSA/CADAA submission a graduation requirement?

Assembly Bill 469, commencing with the 2022-23 school year, requires high schools to "ensure that a grade 12 pupil who has not opted out, completes and submits a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or [the California Dream Act Application (CADAA)]." Evidence that this works can be seen at Val Verde Unified School District, which found that low-income students were not completing and submitting financial aid applications. After making financial aid application completion a graduation requirement, FAFSA/CADAA completion increased 14% from 69% to 83% in the first year of implementation alone. Each year since they started in 2018, they have had less than 10% of seniors opt-out.

After students submit the FAFSA/CADAA, they still need support on the road to accepting their financial aid offer. North Coast Cal-SOAP Success Coaches will be there to support students through all four steps of the process: submitted, completed, awarded, and accepted.

Best Practices for Increasing FAFSA/CADAA Completion Rates

FAFSA/CADAA submission is only the beginning

Submitting a FAFSA or CADAA is just the first of four steps toward unlocking the funding students need to make college affordable. After Submission comes Completion, then a Financial Aid Offer, and finally Award Acceptance. Cal-SOAP financial aid technicians and success coaches can help!

With the implementation of AB 469 this year, our Success Coaches can help reduce the number of students who opt-out of submitting a financial aid application. And remember, 84% of high school seniors who complete a FAFSA/CADAA attend college directly from high school vs. only 55% if they don't!

Best practices for helping students through the process

1 · SUBMISSION

Create FSA ID and submit FAFSA/CADAA application

- FSA ID and Financial Aid Application Workshop for **all** seniors during class time
- Cash for College Workshop in evening for parents
- Utilize customized webgrants reports provided by Cal-SOAP to provide targeted FAFSA/CADAA follow-up support.
- Ensure students set up a Webgrants4Students account
- Financial Aid Parent Night (April or May of junior year) to obtain FSA ID and learn about senior year deadlines

2 · COMPLETION

Error/Unmatched Corrections

- Identify students who are unmatched from Webgrants
- Meet with students to correct errors or missing information

3 · AWARDED

Financial Aid Offer Review and Analysis

- Help students understand their financial aid offer letter and compare financial aid packages
- Provide best practices for students selected for verification process

4 · ACCEPTED

Summer Transition and College Success

- Assist students with submitting college acceptance, transcripts, enrollment, and acceptance of their Financial Aid Offer
- Provide student support to prevent summer melt
- Ensure students understand ongoing requirements and application renewal if receiving a Cal Grant
- Continue support during the first year of college


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COLLEGE PERSISTENCE Success Coaches Placed at CR and Cal Poly Humboldt to Increase Local Students' College Persistence Rates



Our Program Model

Student Success Coaches placed at high schools, Cal Poly Humboldt, and College of the Redwoods will have two roles:

- FAFSA/CADAA support Assisting students and parents through the four areas to receive financial aid
- Implement and lead college and career activities/services/events – Working with your school's designated staff, Success Coaches will organize and lead the activities you decide are most appropriate and beneficial for your students and parents

Other Cal-SOAP Services:

- Events such as Cash for College Workshops, North Coast College and Career Expo, Cal Poly Humboldt's I've Been Admitted to College, Making College Happen, College of the Redwoods' Redwood Days, and more
- Financial Aid training and resources for high school counselors, college access staff, and success coaches
