

3 Steps to FAFSA/CADAA Completion

1

CREATE AN FSA ID (FAFSA filers only)

Go to studentaid.gov

The FSA ID serves as your legal, electronic signature for FAFSA*

(Note: FSA ID not required for CA Dream Act Application (CADAA) for AB 540 eligible students)

Tips for FSA ID creation:

- Legal parent(s) and student all need own ID
- U.S. citizens verify identity with SSN, undocumented parents of FAFSA filers verify using other information.
- Don't use your high school email address
- Ensure information is accurate, but progress quickly. If the account creation form times out it can mean starting the process all over.
- Save your ID where you'll remember, you'll need it every year to renew your FAFSA!

Note: FSA IDs are required in order to access and complete the FAFSA. It's best to create and troubleshoot your FSA ID well before it's time to file the FAFSA to ensure the application process goes smoothly.

Access the FAFSA at <u>studentaid.gov</u> or the CADAA at <u>dream.csac.ca.gov</u>.

What you will need:

- FSA IDs for all contributors (FAFSA only)
- Social Security card or number if you have one (FAFSA only)
- Driver's license, if you have one
- 2022 income and tax information
- Any records of untaxed income such as child support payments, combat pay, short-term disability, or worker's compensation
- List of colleges interested in attending
- Verify all information before submitting

| Complete FAFSA or CADAA (California Dream Act Application, for AB 540 eligible students). The FAFSA/CADAA submission deadline for Cal Grant Consideration at a 4-year college is April 2nd, but students should submit by the earliest financial aid deadline of the schools to which they are applying. Check with the financial aid offices of the colleges you've applied to to see when their priority financial aid deadlines are. CSS Profile due February 1st for all regular decision students. WebGrants 4 Students. Create your WebGrants account about a week after you submit your FAFSA or CADAA to check your Cal Grant award status. Check your account regularly for status updates and to fulfill any additional requirements to claim your grant should you be awarded. | Ensure you have successfully submitted and completed your FAFSA by reviewing your FSS, available at studentaid.gov a few days after submitting your FAFSA. Complete Verification. Some colleges may require additional documentation to verify the information on your FAFSA or CADAA. Send additional documents to a college's financial aid office only upon request. If you are selected for verification, you must submit all requested documents by the college's deadline before you can receive your financial aid. Review and compare financial aid offers from all colleges applied to. Continue applying for scholarships. |

| Intent to enroll and tuition deposit at 4-year | September 2nd is the FAFSA/CADAA submission |
