MEASLES IS <u>NOT</u> COVID:

COVID

MASKING:

Masking helps reduce the risk of spreading or contracting COVID-19.

VACCINATION:

COVID-19 vaccines provide strong protection for serious illness but do not eliminate the possibility of infection or reinfection, especially with new variations.

BOOSTERS:

Boosters are recommended annually for most people.

MEASLES MASKING:

Masking **does NOT** reduce the risk of spreading or contracting measles.

VACCINATION

Measles vaccination generally provides **lifelong immunity**. Two doses of the MMR vaccine are about **97% effective** and provide long-term and possibly lifelong protection against measles.

> **BOOSTERS:** No need for a booster.

MEASLES IS <u>NOT</u> COVID:

MAJOR RISKS OF

Very rarely, COVID-19 can cause death or serious complications in children, usually in children with underlying health conditions.

MAJOR RISKS OF **MEASLES**

- Even healthy children can have serious complications if they contract measles.
- 1 in 20 will get pneumonia
- About **1 in 1,000** will have brain swelling that can cause deafness and intellectual disabilities
- 1-3 in 1,000 will die.

MORE INFORMATION:

One dose of MMR vaccine is 93% effective and two doses are 97% effective.

The first vaccine is usually given at 12-15 months of age, but in the case of an outbreak, doctors may suggest vaccines for children as young as 6 months old.

MEASLES FACT LIST

Measles is one of the MOST contagious viruses known to humans.

Up to 9 in 10 unvaccinated people will become infected if they are exposed to the virus.

1 in 5 people who get measles will be hospitalized, usually for problems breathing.

1 in 20 children who contract measles develop pneumonia.

Symptoms don't appear until four days after exposure.

You can be contagious before you ever show symptoms.
