- Total cases: 554,849 (+95,684)
- Total deaths: 21,942 (+5,372)

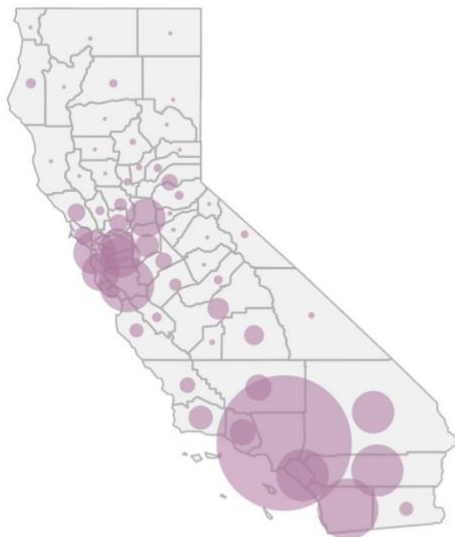

## LOCAL:

### **April 10, 2020 – No New Positive Cases of COVID-19 marking the sixth consecutive day without a new case in Humboldt County.**

Humboldt County Health Officer Dr. Teresa Frankovich said the county could be seeing the effects of social distancing and the Shelter-in-Place Order. “Our last positive result was a week ago,” she said. “It’s important to remember that the virus has not disappeared, we have simply made it much more difficult to spread.”

Frankovich added that the Shelter-in-Place Order continues to be an important part of Humboldt County’s response to the COVID-19 pandemic. “I know we are all eager to move forward and ease some of the restrictions in place,” she said. “Any move to ease shelter-in-place regulations can only be done with solid and informed planning.”

- Total number of hospitalizations: 3
- Total number of deaths: 0

### **Total number of tests run: 1,418**

- Total number of people tested by Public Health Laboratory: 848
- Total number of people tested by all other sources: 570

After receiving additional supplies, the Public Health Laboratory currently has a capacity of approximately 600 tests and can process about 55 samples a day with an approximate turnaround time of 48 to 72 hours. Data available to date indicates the following means of transmission for all Humboldt County cases:
