NATIONAL:

- Total cases 1,571,617 (+20,522)
- Total deaths: 94,150 (+1,089)

**Compared to yesterday's data. Total jurisdictions includes 50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the U.S Virgin Islands.

STATE:

- 88,444 positive cases (+2,247)
- 3,630 deaths (+88)

Approximately 1,466,773 tests have been conducted.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION:

LOCAL:

May 22, 2020 - Three New Cases Confirmed Today

Humboldt County's COVID-19 case count now stands at 91, as three additional positives were confirmed today.



The following information is based on the most recent data available for all confirmed cases:

- Contact to a Known Case: 48 (+2)
- Travel-Acquired: 24 (no chg)
- Community Transmission: 15 (+1)
- Under Investigation: 4 (no chg)

Daily COVID-19 case report for May 22

- Total number of positive cases: 91 (+3)
- Total number of recovered cases: 66 (no chg)
- Total number of hospitalizations: 11 (no chg)
- Total number of deaths: 2
- Total number of people tested by Public Health Laboratory: 2,666
- Total number of people tested by all other sources: 2,420 (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, California Department of Public Health and commercial labs)

The Public Health Laboratory currently has a capacity of approximately 2,100 tests and can process about 65 samples a day with an approximate turnaround time of 48 to 72 hours.

Beginning today, the Humboldt County Joint Information Center will report each Friday the age range of county residents who have tested positive for COVID-19.
