NATIONAL:

- **Total cases 2,624,873 (+43,644)**
- **Total deaths: 127,299 (+560)**

*40 jurisdictions report more than 10,000 cases of COVID-19

STATE:

- **Positive cases: 232,657 (+9,740: 4.4%)**
- **Deaths: 6,090 (+110: 1.8%)**

***4,254,176 tests have been conducted.**

State closes bars, some beach parking, and indoor businesses in counties on Monitoring List
Effective immediately, certain counties must close all bars, some beach parking, and indoor business operations due to risk of infection. This applies to counties that have been on the County Monitoring List for 3 consecutive days. These closures will remain in place for at least 3 weeks. Note: Humboldt County is **NOT** currently on the County Monitoring List, and as such is not affected by these new restrictions.

GOVERNOR NEWSOM UPDATES

Governor Gavin Newsom used his press conference today to outline the new restrictions on counties on the County Monitoring list, as well as reinforce that all Californians should be especially vigilant in taking precautions against COVID-19 during the Fourth of July holiday weekend. State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond today convened a hearing that took a comprehensive look at the role of police officers in schools and the impact that law enforcement presence has on students, learning, and campus safety. The hearing was a three-part panel discussion that examined: different models of school policing, research and data on the impact and consequences of police officers in schools, and a framework for potential policy recommendations for reimagining school safety.

Three additional cases of COVID-19 were reported today, bringing to 136 the total number of Humboldt County residents who have tested positive for the virus.

Two of these new cases were acquired through contact with a known case. The means of transmission for the remaining case is under investigation.
