## July 9, 2020 | Travelers and COVID-19 - How Do Travelers Impact Our Count?

Yesterday, the Humboldt County Public Health reported six positive COVID-19 cases from travelers (residing outside the county) visiting family and friends in Humboldt. These six cases are not included in the county's COVID-19 case count total. Humboldt County Health Officer Dr. Teresa Frankovich pointed out that although these cases will not be reflected in the total case count, they further emphasize the need to adhere to safety measures, including maintaining social distancing and postponing or canceling non-essential travel.

#### **HUMBOLDT COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION**

Given that school bus capacities may be limited due to social distancing requirements, SRTS anticipates that more students may be walking or biking to schools where in-person instruction is happening, HCOE is partnering with the Safe Routes to School Task (SRTS) Force to begin building a webpage of resources for when students return to school.
