On Monday the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), which governs all high school sports in California, announced significant changes to its sports calendar and bylaws for the 2020-2021 school year, and temporarily suspending bylaws that bar students from participating in school sports and club sports at the same time. Humboldt County's count of confirmed COVID-19 cases rose to 195, after six additional cases were reported today. The county alert level remains at Level 2. View <u>the County Dashboard</u> for details on what the alert level means.
