Daily COVID-19 case report for July 31

- Total number of positive cases: 233 (+2)
- Total number of recovered cases: 184 (no chg)
- Total number of hospitalizations: 17 (no chg)
- Total number of deaths: 4 (no chg)

Total tests conducted: 15,458

Overall Alert Level: 3

Follow local and state health orders and guidance.

- Level 1 New Normal Cases are somewhat sporadic, and contact tracing can be used to control the virus. Take every day enhanced precautions.
- Level 2 Moderate Risk Moderate number of cases with majority of cases from a known source. Increase efforts to limit personal exposure.
- Level 3 High Risk Many cases with conditions for community spread, with many undetected cases likely. Limit everyday activities to increase safety.
- Level 4 Very High Risk Widespread outbreak that is growing with many undetected cases. Take strong measures to limit all contact.

Public Health Laboratory testing Information

- Supply capacity: Approximately 2,500 tests
- Testing capacity: 85 samples per day
 - o 24-72 hours
- Positivity Rate: 3.6%* (0.3%)
