NATIONAL:

- Total cases 5,064,171 (+40,522)
- Total deaths: 162,407 (+565)

STATE:

- Positive cases: 554,160 (+20,251)*
- Deaths: 10,468 (+109)

August 11, 2020 – Seven New Cases Reported Today

Humboldt County's total number of residents who have tested positive for COVID-19 now stands at 293, after seven new cases were reported today.

Humboldt County Health Officer Dr. Teresa Frankovich reminds the community that a stocked emergency kit is important to have on hand for all kinds of events, including the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Many of the supplies that are recommended to keep on hand for unexpected emergencies such as earthquakes and power outages can be just as useful during a pandemic," Dr. Frankovich said. "Keeping a store of non-perishable food and extra prescription medications can come in handy if someone in your home becomes ill with COVID-19 and everyone needs to stay put during quarantine."

The following information is based on the most recent data available for all confirmed cases:

Humboldt County Dashboard

Daily COVID-19 case report

- Total number of positive cases: 293 (+7)
- Total number of recovered cases: 233 (no chg)
- Total number of hospitalizations: 19 (no chg)
- Total number of deaths: 4 (no chg)

Total tests conducted: 17,653

Overall Alert Level: 3

Follow local and state health orders and guidance.

- Level 1 New Normal Cases are somewhat sporadic, and contact tracing can be used to control the virus. Take everyday enhanced precautions.
- Level 2 Moderate Risk Moderate number of cases with majority of cases from a known source. Increase efforts to limit personal exposure.
- Level 3 High Risk Many cases with conditions for community spread, with many undetected cases likely. Limit everyday activities to increase safety.
- Level 4 Very High Risk Widespread outbreak that is growing with many undetected cases. Take strong measures to limit all contact.

Public Health Laboratory testing Information

- Supply capacity: Approximately 2,250 tests
- Testing capacity: 75 samples per day
 - 24-72 hours
- Positivity Rate: 3.2%*
 *over past week
