NATIONAL:

- Total cases: 15,219
- Total deaths: 201
- Jurisdictions reporting cases: 54 (50 states, District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and US Virgin Islands)

Data include both confirmed and presumptive positive cases of COVID-19 reported to CDC or tested at CDC since January 21, 2020, with the exception of testing results for persons repatriated to the United States from Wuhan, China and Japan. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.

STATE:

CALIFORNIA: 1,066 cases; 19 deaths (does not include cases connected with the Grand Princess)

- -- 24 cases are repatriation flights
- -- 86 cases are travel-related
- -- 108 cases are due to close contact
- -- 266 community transmission
- -- 522 under investigation

Twenty-two public health labs in California are testing samples for COVID-19, according to the California Department of Public Health.

Governor Updates:

Governor Gavin Newsom announced yesterday that he has sent a letter to President Donald Trump requesting the immediate deployment of the USNS Mercy Hospital Ship to the Port of Los Angeles through September 1, 2020, to help decompress the state's health care delivery system in Los Angeles in response to COVID-19.
