Earth is the only planet that we are absolutely sure we can live on. If we trash it, we won't have anywhere else to go.




Before we explore the universe, and abandon our home that worked hard to keep every living thing alive, we should help our home too.

There are
5.25 trillion
pieces of
plastic debris
in the ocean.



Of that mass,
269,000 tons float on
the surface, while
some four billion
plastic microfibers
per square kilometer
litter the deep sea.



Plastic accumulating in our oceans and on our beaches has become a global crisis. Billions of pounds of plastic can be found in swirling convergences that make up about 40 percent of the world's ocean surfaces





Starting with an estimate that 150 million tonnes of plastic are already polluting the world's oceans, and that "leakage" adds at least 9.1 million tonnes more each year — a figure that is said to be growing by five per cent annually — the MacArthur report calculates there will be 850-950 million tonnes of ocean trash in 2050!



That means that there will be more trash than fish
in the sea!

My super heroine wants to stop this from happening. She goes around the rivers of the world and scoops up trash before it gets to the oceans. She even takes swimming classes so she can rescue poor sea animals from eating or getting caught in trash in the sea.

She uses her litter grabber to snatch stuff from storm drains.

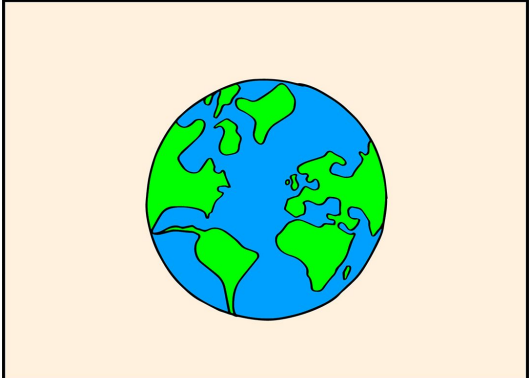
She uses her net to pluck trash from the water
